Course Remarks:

1. Students without any prior background in accounting are required to take ACCT-1106 in preparation for ACCT-1107.
2. Six credits of humanities and/or social science are recommended.
3. Students wishing to obtain a certificate in Financial Services must complete the following courses as part of their elective credits: ACCT-2106, ADMN-2116, ECON-2017, ECON-3127, MKTG-3126 and ORGS-3837.

Program Remarks:

1. All students must be awarded a total of 90 credits towards this program (45 core credits and 45 elective credits).
2. All students must complete a minimum of 30 business credits directly through Nipissing University.
3. All students may use a maximum of 42 first year credits towards this program.
4. All students must have a minimum overall average of 60% to be considered for graduation.

How to choose courses:

1. Courses listed on the left of your program are the core courses for your program (you must obtain credit in these), while the spaces provided on the right are meant to assist your tracking of elective courses as you complete them.
2. Courses shown in WebAdvisor with a grade of 'TR' have been granted to you as advanced standing and may be applied towards your program.
3. Prior to registering, determine what courses you have left to complete for the program (areas not yet filled in) and compare these to the course offerings currently available through distance education to decide what courses may interest you for the upcoming semester.
4. Register in your selected course(s) on WebAdvisor ensuring that you have completed the necessary prerequisites first (course description's and prerequisite information can be found in the Academic Calendar).
5. Keep track of the courses that you have successfully completed throughout your program on the program plan provided. This will help you select courses for future semesters.

Things to keep in mind:

- a) If you are currently working full-time, we suggest that you attempt one course in your first semester. This will give you time to learn how courses progress and how to use Blackboard, while with letting you determine how many courses you will be comfortable in future semesters.
