Synchronous Video Conferencing Options at NU

Comparisons and FAQs:

The table below compares the four synchronous (video conferencing) platforms available at Nipissing University. Please remember that Blackboard Learn is our institutionally supported Learning Management System (LMS) — thus every course MUST have a presence there. While much of what you post on the LMS within your course shells is asynchronous, we recognize there are many times when synchronous activities are necessary (and even encouraged).

Blackboard Collaborate is the preferred video-conferencing platform for teaching (given its integration with Blackboard Learn), but we recognize at certain times, with certain sizes of classes, and with specific activities, other platforms might suit your needs better. As such, we have attempted to categorize the 4 platforms most commonly used, and institutionally supported.

**PLEASE NOTE: Blackboard Collaborate, Microsoft TEAMS and Google Meet are all freely accessible to all NU Faculty, Staff and Students. NU has institution-wide licences to these platforms. If you would like to use Zoom you have 3 options:

- 1. Create a free account (this may not include all the features listed above and limits sessions to 40-minutes);
- 2. Request to use one of NU's limited institutional accounts (scheduling and support depends on timing of other event/priorities and availability of UTS staff. Email videoconf@nipissingu.ca to inquire);
- 3. Purchase your own Zoom licence (visit https://zoom.us for details). This option could be supported by your PER, or departmental/Faculty funds; however, that discussion needs to occur beforehand, so contact your Dean's Office for approval first. If you choose option 3; please inform utsprocurement@nipissingu.ca in UTS that you are doing so, as we are monitoring the number of individual licences being purchased. This is to ascertain if we reach certain thresholds in the future we may be able upgrade to an NU institution-wide licence.
