REGISTRATION

All students entering the Consecutive Bachelor of Education program or Year 5 of Concurrent Education will be registered in all of their courses by the Office of the Registrar. An email will be sent to your Nipissing Email account (see below) once the timetable is ready for viewing. You will be able to view your timetable through Web Advisor no later than August 18th.

You have been assigned a Nipissing University email account and will notice an email tab when you log into 'My Nipissing'. This Outlook account will be the only email account used to communicate with you. **It is vital that you check your email daily for up-to-date program information and important faculty and university communications.**

Please visit the website (above) to view important information regarding tuition, fees, due dates and frequently asked questions. Fall fees are due by September 18th, 2023.

NOTE: If you are hoping to use OSAP to pay your fees, please ensure that your file is complete by Aug. 1. We will confirm your enrolment electronically starting the third week in August and direct payments to the university for fall term fees owing at the time. The Loans Centre will direct funding to Nipissing to cover fees (as per our instructions) and the remainder, if any, should be deposited into the bank account you set up through your MSFAA approximately one week after the start of class.

Please check the "net cost by term" view on your WebAdvisor statement of account (starting end-August) to confirm if there is a remaining fall term balance that will need to be covered by you (by Sept. 18).

If you have government student loans from prior years AND ARE NOT ACCESSING OSAP THIS YEAR, you need to complete a Continuation of Interest Free Status form online (on the OSAP website – Ontario.ca/OSAP), to qualify for non-repayment status on your prior loans.

Nipissing University provides a self-serve option* to generate proof of enrolment letters via WebAdvisor.

Please note – a Proof of Enrolment/Registration letter is only available when a student is registered in classes. It is recommended to use Google Chrome or Firefox as it does not work with Explorer.

- Login to MyNipissing at <http://my.nipissingu.ca>
- Click on Go to WebAdvisor.
- Click Students, and under the Academic Profile menu, click Proof of Enrolment Letter.
- From the drop-down lists select your program and term and then click the submit button.
- Click the Proof of Enrolment Letter (PDF) button to open your proof of enrolment letter.

*currently the self-serve option is provided free of charge. If the electronic proof of enrolment letter is not sufficient for your needs, or if you require a separate form to be completed by the University, please visit the Office of the Registrar or complete the request form at the link above or contact us at poe@nipissingu.ca. Specialized documentation is provided at an additional cost.
