Rights of workers

- 1. The right to know about health and safety matters.
- The right to participate in decisions that could affect their health and safety.
- 3. The right to refuse work that could affect their health and safety and that of others.



What to do when an incident occurs:

- Call 911 if it is a critical injury.
- Seek/administer first aid or notify campus security or one of the campus first aid designates.
- Complete an incident report via the campus health and safety website as soon as you can.
- Notify your immediate supervisor of the incident.

Examples of workplace incidents:

- An employee not wearing proper PPE.
- Slips and fall on icy surfaces.



Incident or Injury Reporting Timeline:

- The health and safety team is required to report
 all critical injury like a broken bone, excessive loss of blood etc., to the
 Ministry of Labour within 48 hours of its occurrence.
- If an incident requires medical attention (ER, Clinic, family physician or health professional), the health and safety team have 3 days from when the incident report was submitted to report this incident to WSIB.

N/B: Late fees may be applicable.
