Equipment Inspections. Why Equipment Inspections Matter:

- Regular inspections create a safe work environment.
- Early detections prevent sudden breakdowns.
- Become familiar with the equipment you operate.
- Proper training and review of the safe operating procedure.
- Minimize the risk of Accidents and Injuries.

When Inspecting equipment:

- Always get and read a copy of the SOP and Manual.
- Be properly trained and use recommended PPE.
- Specify when the inspection occurs to track its frequency.
- Qualified individual responsible for inspecting equipment.
- Create a checklist specific to the equipment you're inspecting.
- Signoff, Date and time indicating equipment is safe for use.
