

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY & IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Under Nipissing University's Institutional Quality Assurance Process (IQAP) and the Ontario Universities Quality Assurance Framework (QAF), all programs are subject to a comprehensive review every eight years at minimum, as required to meet provincial quality assurance protocols and to support the ongoing rigour and coherence of the program. This review was conducted under the terms and conditions of the IQAP, re-ratified by the Ontario Universities Council on Quality Assurance May 5, 2023 and approved by Senate on June 29, 2023.

In academic years 2024-2025 a program review was scheduled for Bachelor of Arts - Anthropology. This was the first review for this program. The timeline of the review was as follows.

Bachelor of Science - Anthropology

The follow program strengths were noted:

The Anthropology program was praised as dynamic and future-focused, with innovative pedagogy, curriculum design, and faculty research. It emphasizes contemporary research methodologies, critical theory, environmental anthropology, and anti-colonial frameworks, making it unique regionally and nationally. The program also aligns strongly with the university's 2024-2025 Strategic Plan, particularly in truth and reconciliation and sustainability through practical learning experiences

Summary of review team recommendations:

Key recommendations include pursuing an Honours program, exploring curricular collaborations, creating a Certificate in Cultural Resource Management, innovating marketing strategies, expanding online course offerings, and adding another faculty member
