

SAS Testing Centre Participation Expectations

The Student Accessibility Services (SAS) Testing Centre is committed to providing an accessible and respectful environment for students writing accommodated tests and exams. These Participation Expectations are intended to help ensure that accommodations are delivered effectively while maintaining a fair and supportive testing environment for all students.

Students are responsible for reviewing these expectations before attending a scheduled test or exam. If you have questions about any of the expectations listed below, please contact Student Accessibility Services before your scheduled test.

Arriving for your test:

- Cannot be more than 30 mins late or may not be able to write the test for in person midterms/exams
- After 30 minutes we will need to contact the professor for permission
- Late arrivals will not receive extra time to compensate
- Please respect the nut-free and scent-free environment

Bringing items to the SAS Testing Centre:

- Only bring what is necessary or use lockers provided
- Water only
- No food unless supported by an accommodation
- Bring a pencil and all necessary supplies
- No cell phones or smart watches are permitted
- Only SAS-approved or personal, wired (non-Bluetooth) headphones are allowed.
- Memory aids, cue sheets etc. will be collected after the test/exam (even when approved for the entire class).

For concerns during testing:

- If writing with our testing centre, immediately alert the proctor of any issues with accommodations, technology or your wellbeing.

Testing Integrity

- All testing areas are actively monitored by video surveillance.
- During final exams, you may be escorted when taking breaks.
