Prepositions Exercise 9

SINCE/FOR/AGO

Examples:

- 1. He has worked there **since** January.
- 2. He worked there **for** six months.
- 3. He has worked there **for** six months.
- 4. He came to Canada six months ago.

Since denotes action from some indicated time in the past, up to the present time. Therefore, the present perfect tense of the verb (has worked) is required.

For refers to duration, or length of time. It may be used in the present, past, or future tense.

Ago refers to the past tense. It is used only with the past tense.
